NATIONAL SCIENCE WEEK - WORMLEY SCIENCE WEEK Monday 13th March - Friday 17th March



This year's science week - Animal Kingdoms - was focused on learning about animals.

Last week, children in YR-Y5 had a fantastic day at Paradise Park observing and learning about the animals there. Some of the children in

Reception were able to stroke a snake in the Reptile House. Many enjoyed the Animal Antics show in the Jungle Theatre, the Red Panda and Big Cat talks.



y6 children had a great workshop about evolution and adaptation whilst at Woburn Safari Park. The children loved how the

monkeys jumped on the bus roof and seeing the lions roam around up close.

Children in YN and Preschool had an amazing visit by Safari Pete to school.

Throughout the week the children have watched exerts from David Attenborough's films, learning more about animals in their natural environment.

What do you want to be when you grow up?

SECONDARY TRANSFER

NATIONAL ASSESSMENT

Children in Y6 will sit their SATs exams during the week commencing 8th May.

DIGITAL LITERACY

Do you monitor the length of time your children are playing electronic games or are online? Research by members of Wormley Pupil Parliament suggests that a large majority of children claim to spend over 4 hours a day playing games or

being online.

There is much research being undertaken about this.

We know that video games are entertaining, enjoyable and beneficial to children in many ways. They educate, provide space for creativity and offer healthy social interaction. But at the same time, the best examples are highly moreish and children will push boundaries to play for increasing lengths of time.

"It is agreed that excessive screen time - over four hours with no break - can be a bad thing. There is a lot of research on this. However, we should also consider time of day, weekends versus school days and the age of the child." Andy Phippen, professor of social responsibility in IT at Plymouth University.


Clinical physiologist Dr Tanya Byron reported that 7% of teens in the UK play more than 30 hours of computer games a week in her report, Safe Children in a Digital World. She claims that gaming can become addictive and asks parents to be aware of their children and to identify when things are getting a bit much - playing every day, devoting long periods of time, sacrificing other activities, neglecting homework and moodiness...

We have to educate our children to stay healthy in all sorts of ways and this may be an area to monitor more carefully.

We hope to be able to offer some workshops around safety online for children and families very soon – look out for more information to help you to support your children.
