WHO TEACHES CHILDREN THE MOST ANYWAY?

Schools have long been known as the place where children go to learn, however, when you do the maths...

Assuming children sleep eight hours a day.

- 24 hours a day minus eight sleeping hours = 16 waking hours a day;
- 365 days a year × 18 years = 6,570 days; and
- 6,570 days × 16 waking hours = 105,120 waking hours by age 18.
- The average child spends six hours a day at school for 180 school days a year;
- 180 school days × six hours per day = 1,080 hours per school year;
- 1,080 hours × 13 school years = 14,040 school hours; and
- 14,040 school hours divided by 105,120 waking hours = 13.36% of waking hours are spent in school by age 18.

That means 86.64% of children's time is spent out of school, mainly at home.

Therefore, parents are the most powerful teachers of their children!

How can you make the most of this time?

- Find time to talk about anything. This develops their language, their vocabulary and their confidence because they have something to talk about.
- Let your children see you reading, whether it's books, magazines, newspapers, or catalogues and talk to the children about what you are reading.
- Help then to practise their handwriting to develop their writing muscles.
- Include children in everyday projects. Ordinary activities like washing the car, making salad for dinner, working together on a computer spreadsheet, or shopping for a gift for grandad's birthday are packed with learning opportunities.
- Help them to learn their times tables. This helps them to be more fluent with all maths.
- Teach them to tell the time.
- Get your children involved in their family history.
- Explore the local environment. Lots of places are free museums, parks, the woods, the river etc.

THE VIKING WORKSHOP



On Wednesday 26th September, the Y6 children travelled back in time to 1066 when William the Conqueror became King of England after the Battle of Hastings.

The first place the Vikings raided in Britain in AD793 was the monastery at Lindisfarne, a small holy island located off the northeast coast of England. No matter how many times, the Vikings were driven off the island of Great Britain, they kept returning until they finally conquered England in 1066 and changed the course of history forever.





The children learnt what it was like to live

as a Viking - learning how to battle, to cook, to eat etc. In the afternoon they worked as archeologists to examine artefacts and make deductions about history using evidence.





REMEMBRANCE

2018 marks the centenary of the end of the First World war. On the centenary of the Armistice, thanks will be given for peace and for those that returned from the Great War and our prayers for those that lost their lives.

WORMLEY'S PRIMARY SCHOOL COFE RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES POLICY

We have recently reviewed Class Charters in line with our Rights and Responsibilities Policy.

There are 4 rights:

To be safe and healthy To learn and achieve To be respected To be treated equally

These rights are in line with the rights of UNICEF.

For each right, the children have identified 4 responsibilities. These are on display in the classrooms, corridors and playgrounds, and the children are held accountable to them.

HELLO YELLOW DAY

Did you know that three children in every classroom are likely to have a diagnosable mental health condition?

In order to raise awareness of good mental health and well-being, we planned our term's Enrichment Day to coincide with national *Hello Yellow Day*.

Throughout the day the children had the opportunity to experience a range of activities designed to promote good mental health and emotional well-being. They began the day with physical activity - Wake and Shake - to get the endorphins flowing.

They then learnt about *resilience*, taking the model of the learning pit...

We all fall 'in the pit' when things are hard, and it is ok to be there, as it requires you to reflect, problem solve, persevere and find a way out.

We use strategies we have learned, other people and thinking to get us out of the pit.

Next, the children studied some well known 'Resilient Heroes'. People such as Stephen Hawkin, Mahatma Gandhi, Helen Keller, Michael Jordan, Jim McLaren who overcame great adversity to be highly successful in their field. They then thought about a time when they had overcome difficulty and narrated their success and how they achieved that success.

A set of emojis were introduced, to help the children express their feelings.





Over the day, the children engaged in mindfulness activities, yoga, quiet time and more exercise (through the daily mile) to help relax the body and mind.

KS1 re-introduced the Worry Monster to their children in case they have things that are bothering them.

Each class decided on different activities such as Forest School, a Welly Walk, music, dance, art, cookery etc. as additional activities for the day.

It was a lovely day and the children have learnt some important lessons about keeping their mind and body healthy.

Why does it matter?

- 1 in 10 children and young people, aged 5-16, suffer from a diagnosable mental health problem such as depression, anxiety or an eating disorder. That's around 3 children in every classroom.
- 10% of young people deliberately harm themselves regularly.
- 3/4 of long-lasting mental ill health starts before the age of 18.


