SATS AND WHOLE SCHOOL ASSESSMENT WEEKS

It is also a time for children to really focus in their learning as assessments of their attainment and progress take place this term, including national assessments - Y2 and Y6 SATs, Y1 Phonic Screening and end of EYFS assessment.

Monday 14th – Thursday 17th May, the Year 6 children sit their national SATs tests.

Year 2 children will be assessed for the end of key stage achievement during the last few weeks of half term and the week following half term (beginning 21st May – 24th May).

Year 1 children will have a Phonic Screening check during the week beginning 11th June.
