Therefore, **the school** has a responsibility to...

- Guide children with upholding the school's rights and responsibilities
- Support children's mental health, wellbeing and safety by providing a safe, supportive and caring environment
- Uphold Christian values, respecting and including other religious beliefs and non-religious beliefs
- Develop the children's character by supporting them to grow in greater awareness of themselves and others, as individuals and learners, through our social learning agenda
- Help and encourage child to try their best and to maximise their learning potential
- Offer all children opportunities to develop a sense of agency and to take responsibility, form healthy social relationships and build their self-esteem

Therefore, **<u>parents</u> / <u>carers</u>** have a responsibility to...

- Support the school to ensure their child maintains a consistently high standard of behaviour and respect for others
- Encourage and support their child to try their best so they can maximise their learning potential
- Ensure their child attends school regularly and on time, notifying the school if their child is absent
- Ensure their child is dressed in the correct uniform, including their PE kit, and has all the relevant equipment needed for learning. A child's appearance should be appropriate for school
- Treat all members of the school community with dignity, care and respect
- Communicate to the teacher / senior leaders any concerns about their child that may affect their behaviour in school or their ability to learn
- Ensure communication with the school is respectful, making every reasonable effort to address any communications to the appropriate member of staff



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Therefore, the children have the responsibility to ...

- Arrive at school on time and ready to learn
- Follow instructions from the adults at school
- Engage in school life and pay attention when learning
- Try their best to learn, practise often and ask for help if needed
- Wear the correct school uniform, including PE kit
- Bring all the equipment needed each day
- Consider people's feelings and solve problems peacefully
- Treat others with dignity, respect and fairness
- Listen, share and show kindness
- Include others in their learning and play
