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



There will still be a *soft start* at the start of the day to allow for parents to drop children at the different entrances. Please arrive between **8:45 and 8:55am**. Once in school, children will settle to a learning task. At the end of the day, parents will

collect their children from the same entrance as the one they dropped them to.

Morning registers will close at <u>8:55 am</u> - after this point your child will be marked as late.

# Attendance

Attendance is compulsory if children are well. If children are not well enough to attend, it is <u>essential</u> that parents make the school aware of the reason for any pupil absence <u>before</u> the start of the day by emailing

If parents do not let us know why their child is absent, a member of the school admin team will have to phone the family of every child who is not

in school. This forms part of our safeguarding practices.



We expect all children to be dressed in the school uniform. This includes grey trousers/skirts, pale blue tops and mid blue sweatshirts, and black shoes or trainers. The school logo is optional on items of uniform. Jewellery should not be worn to school.

Our Y6 children performed a great play, set in the Wild West , which was enjoyed by all the children and their families.








# OUR VALUE OF THE HALF TERM IS UNITY

The total raised for Happy Days Children's Charity was £1451.




# REMINDER - ABSENCE FOR HOLIDAYS

We have seen an increase in absence in the final week of term with some families not informing us that their child will be absent or letting us know on the day of departure on holiday. Any such absences will not be authorised and could result in a penalty notice being issued. All planned absence should be requested at least 2 weeks in advance giving clear reasons, with supporting evidence, as to why absence is unavoidable.

### ARTS WEEK

The children have really enjoyed our Arts Weeks. In Art, they have been studying artists, including Andy Warhol, Hockney and Henri Rousseau.





They have been experimenting with different mediums such as clay, paint, pastels and watercolour.

In Music, Y6 have had our music specialist who has been teaching pulse, rhythm and pitch as the children learn to play the ukulele. Whilst different genres have been learnt in different year groups, including reggae, pop and motown.

# FRENCH LEARNING

It has been a pleasure to see the children excel in using the French language and appreciating the culture of France.

As we say au revoir to **Year 6**, it has been moving to see them take the French language and their knowledge of French culture to give them confidence when studying a Modern Foreign Language option at their future secondary school. Bonne chance aux classes 6!

Meanwhile, **Year 5** has learnt about the French Revolution in which the absolute monarch in France was overthrown to create a Republic. As a result, the leader of the country was no longer a member of the royal family and therefore these days there is no king or queen in France, but instead, they have a president. The revolution is celebrated every year on 14<sup>th</sup> July in France with '**Fete de la Bastille**'. On the same day we remembered the events of the revolution by sharing baguettes – these breads are a symbol of the revolution because it had partly been caused by a wheat and grain shortage leading to high prices for bread. Baguette means stick (baton).

In Lower Key Stage 2, **Year 3** studied Louis XIV - the French king who had the



longest reign in France – 72 years and 110 days! However, he did become king when he was just 4 years old!

Finally in **Year 4** we learnt about the French leader Napoleon, who left us with the amazing quote "The word *impossible* is not in my dictionary."
