On Thursday 8th February we had a hugely successful enrichment day. We were delighted to welcome Ashleigh Nelson, English sprinter who specialises in the 100 metres. She was the fastest sprinter in the world at the age of 15 and was selected to represent Great Britain at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and be part of the Great Britain Relay Team in 2014

Ashleigh spoke to the pupils about her journey and career in professional sport and the time, dedication and resilience required to become an Olympic champion.

She showed her medals to the children, inspiring many of them.

After assembly, Ashleigh led fitness activities for every year group – the pupils thoroughly enjoyed her workshops and were full of praise for her.

Admissions to nursery schools and nursery classes in schools are now managed directly by the schools and not by Herts County Council.

If you wish your child to attend Wormley Nursery, or the nursery classes at Rye Park, Cranbourne, St Augustines, Broxbourne or Sheredes Schools you need to fill in an application form at the school.



All applications must be handed in by 9th March. Letters offering places will be sent out on to parents in the week beginning 26th March, and you will have until 20th April to accept or refuse the places you have been offered.

ATTENDANCE

Our attendance is back up to 96% but we must aim for at least 97%.

We have had to issue fines to a few families when attendance falls below acceptable levels.

Obviously unless children are sick, they need to be in school to learn.

READING CHALLENGE TERM



Don't forget the Reading Challenge at Wormley School this term.

The government expectation is that children in Year 2 can read 90 words a minute and children in Year 6 can read 150 words per minute. They need to read with this fluency to cope with the tasks/tests

Therefore, daily practice is the only way to improve fluency.

We have invested £1800 in new reading books across the school so the children will have more choice in the books they take home to read. We have been advised to change books less frequently and encourage children to read and re-read the same book to develop greater fluency and deeper understanding.

We are able to tell which children are reading regularly by looking at their reading records. This helps us to decide who needs extra support. Please record in the reading records when you read each day.



Children can collect raffle tickets as rewards for reading at home and in school - in fact anywhere!

There is a prize draw each week on a Friday and a Grand Prize Draw at the end of term for

3 sets of family vouchers for a trip to the cinema!

We are also running a Sponsored Reading Challenge this term in conjunction with Osbourne Books. This will raise funds for more books to add to our class libraries. Please sponsor your child.



WORLD BUOK DAY

1st March is National World Book Day.

Children can dress as a character from a favourite book for the day.



Don't make reading a chore - make sure it's an enjoyable experience. Save a 10 minute time slot each day to snuggle up with your child and share a book, poem or magazine. Take it in turn to read to each other. Choose books they enjoy. Praise them for their reading.

Please encourage and read with your child as much as possible, at least every day, whatever their age. This will make a difference and will support your child to achieve their potential.

We can all learn to forgive others for their mistakes just as we like to be forgiven for ours.



NATIONAL SCIENCE WEEK 2018

9th - 18th March

This year's science week - Space and Time - has a focus the Earth in Space and the concept of Time.



Children will be working scientifically by: investigating the Earth as a planet in a solar system, comparing the time of day at different places on the Earth; creating simple models of the solar system; constructing simple shadow clocks and sundials; looking for, and measuring, shadows, and finding out how they are formed and what might cause the shadows to change; looking for patterns in what happens to shadows when the light source moves, using shadow puppets;

exploring falling paper cones or cup-cake cases, and designing and making a variety of parachutes and carrying out fair tests to determine which designs are the most effective; exploring resistance in water by making and testing boats of different shapes; exploring the effects of air resistance by observing how different objects such as parachutes and sycamore seeds fall; designing and making a variety of parachutes; carrying out fair tests to determine which designs are the most effective.



Throughout the week we will follow up specific learning linked to each year group's unit of learning from the Science National Curriculum. The children will watch some of the amazing science documentaries

YEAR 4 OPERA PROJECT -

Our Y4 children will once again have the opportunity to be involved in an opera project with three local schools.

The opera this year is María Stuarda - a tragic opera in two acts, by Gaetano Donizetti, to a libretto by Giuseppe Bardari. The opera is one of a number of operas by Donizetti which deal with the Tudor period in English history. The story is loosely based on the lives of Mary, Queen of Scots (Mary Stuart) and her cousin Queen Elizabeth I.



The children will learn about the opera in detail and then watch a children's performance at Sheredes School on Wednesday 27th June.
