# LEARNING CONSULTATION EVENINGS

It was lovely to see so many families at the consultation evenings.

## WELL BEING

Next month we will be assessed for our work towards a Well Being Award.

The pupils' well-being is central to our school and we have been trialling strategies to support the children such as the Daily Mile (exercise), Mindfulness (being present and calm in the moment) and emotional check-ins (to recognise our feelings).

If you have any feedback about these strategies, please let us know. This week is the school's <u>Well Being Week</u> - the children will take part in yoga, walks, relaxation and other activities.

#### ENRICHMENT DAY

I LOVE MY PLAKET

On Thursday 14th February we had a very interesting enrichment day learning about how we might love our planet more. We wanted the children to make connections between their actions and the impact of their actions. We wanted them to recognise their responsibility for looking after the planet.

The children watched videos about the plastic pollution of the seas and learned how much waste we all make each year.

Did you know?

Each of us will send 64 tons of waste to landfills over our lifetime.

Every day, a person sends 20 gallons of sewage through the system.

In the UK over **35.8 million bottles** are consumed each day, with **16 million** of these failing to reach plastic recycling facilities.

The children were asked to make a pledge and these included using less plastic throw away bottle, switching off lights when they are not needed, composting fruit and vegetable waste, collecting litter from around school and learning more about protecting the planet.

We had a fantastic assembly where each class presented their learning.



#### NURSERY ADMISSIONS

Admissions to nursery schools and nursery classes in schools are managed directly by the schools and not by Herts County Council.

If you wish your child to attend the nursery classes at Wormley, you need to fill in an application form at the school.

All applications should be handed in by 15<sup>th</sup> March. Letters offering confirmed places will be sent out to parents in the week beginning 29<sup>th</sup> March. You will have until 26<sup>th</sup> April to accept or refuse the places you have been offered. Morning places will be offered first to families requesting 30 hours.

#### READING CHALLENGE TERM



Don't forget the Reading Challenge at Wormley School this term.

The government expectation is that children in Year 2 can read 90 words a minute and children in Year 6 can read 150 words per minute. They need to read with this fluency to cope with the tasks/tests and to access the full curriculum. Daily practice is the only way to improve fluency.

We have invested £1300 in new home reading books across the school so the children will have more choice in the books they take home to read. We have been advised to change books less frequently and encourage children to read and re-read the same book to develop greater fluency and deeper understanding.


We are able to tell which children are reading regularly by looking at their reading records. This helps us to decide who needs extra support. Please record in the reading records when you read each day.

# WORLD BOOK DAY

7th March is National World Book Day.

Children can dress as a character from a favourite book or alternatively dress as the book ..... draw a front cover, write a blurb for the back cover, make a sandwich board and hook it over your head!

Don't make reading a chore - make sure it's an enjoyable experience. Save a 10 minute time slot each day to snuggle up with your child and share a book, poem or magazine. Take it in turn to read to each other. Choose books children enjoy. Praise them for their reading.

Please encourage and read with your child as much as possible, at least every day, whatever their age. This will make a difference and will support your child to achieve their potential.

#### NATIONAL SCIENCE WEEK 2018

11<sup>th</sup> - 15<sup>h</sup> March

This year's science week - The Origin of Birds - has a focus on animals and their habitats.

Did you know?

The scientific question of within which larger group of animals birds evolved, has traditionally been called the **origin of birds**. The present scientific consensus is that birds are a group of theropod dinosaurs that originated during the Mesozoic Era.

Children will be working scientifically by: identifying and grouping the species; comparing their movements, their appearance, their adaptations, their habitats; researching the gestation period of birds; asking questions, following lines of enquiry, making careful observations, taking measurements, recording, classifying and reporting findings.

We will be incubating and hatching chicks over a 2 week period. There will be an opportunity for children to watch how chicks hatch from an egg by watching first hand.



The week will begin on **Monday 11th March** with a visit from a number of owls who will fly silently across the children's heads as they gather in the hall. The children will then become scientists, dissecting owl pellets to identify the diet of owls.

Do you know your blackbird from your swallow?

Perhaps not.

This week children will learn about different species of birds and learn to recognise and name the common garden birds. This will help them take part in the **Big Garden Birdwatch** January 2020.

Since the best way to learn is through first-hand experience, we have arranged 3 visits to RSPB Rye

Meads Nature Reserve, Rye Rd, Hoddesdon, Hertfordshire SG12 8JS

Letters have been sent to all children. At the reserve, the children will be able to visit bird hides so they can observe wetland birds and garden birds.

Throughout the week we will follow up specific learning linked to each year group's unit of learning from the Science National Curriculum.
