
CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

When we return to school in the Autumn Term, we will have entered **Step 4** of the government's roadmap. Guidance regarding management of the pandemic will have changed significantly. There will be no requirement for children to be in bubbles, for staggered start and finish times and staggered lunches. There will be no social distancing or wearing of face masks. Children will not need to isolate if they have been in contact with someone with the virus.

However, some of the changes last year have been appreciated by children, staff and families and we have chosen to keep some of our new practices.

There will still be staggered start and finish times and a *soft start* for each class to allow for children to enter the classroom and to wash their hands before settling to a learning task.

At the end of the day, parents will collect their children from the same entrance as the one they dropped them to.

Morning registers will close at 9:10 am - after this point your child will be marked as late.

Playtimes and lunchtimes

Playtimes will still be staggered so that children have more space to play on the playground/field.

Snacks are provided in Early Years and KS1. Children may bring a healthy snack in KS2

(fruit/vegetable).

Children will continue to have lunchtime slots for eating their lunch in our dining areas but children will be able to mix in the playgrounds.

Good Hygiene Practices


Children will be asked to practice good hygiene including frequent handwashing and using a tissue when sneezing or blowing their nose. Children suffering from eczema can bring their own hand soap or cream if it is clearly labelled.

We have lots of social stories to help children with this.

Attendance

Attendance is compulsory if children are well. If children are not well, they should not attend. It is <u>essential</u> that parents make the school aware of the reason for any pupil absence <u>before</u> the start of the day by emailing <u>attendance@wormleyprimary.co.uk</u>.



If parents do not let us know why their child is absent, a member of the school admin team will have to phone the family of every child who is not in school.

As winter approaches, your child may experience symptoms such as a cough or a temperature. To rule out COVID, please test your child before they return to school to keep the spread of the virus low.

Uniform

Children are expected to wear our school uniform when they return in September. Please see the website if you need to clarify what children should wear to school and for PE.

PE kits should be worn all day on the day children have PE.

Payments via Arbor

Payments for school meals, Breakfast and After School Club (BASC), resources etc. should continue to be made via online payments using Arbor. There is also a post box in front of reception.

Healthy Home Packed Lunches and Water Bottles

A reminder that home packed lunches must be healthy and meet all nutritional expectations for meals consumed in school. Water bottles - marked with children's names - are essential.

Breakfast and After School Club (BASC)

Breakfast and After School Club can be booked via Arbor for the Autumn Term.

Trips, Visits and Visitors

We have already booked history workshops and visits for the Autumn Term. Please check the website for dates on the calendar.

We will also be using the local environment for local History studies.

Home Learning and Remote Learning

In preparation for any possible isolation periods (due to having contracted COVID), and for setting home learning, we will continue to use *Tapestry* for Preschool, YN and YR and the *Google Classroom* for Y1- Y6. Please ensure you have access to these platforms.

When to isolate or take a test

Pupils, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. Children and adults should not come to school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, if they are required to quarantine).

If anyone in our school should develop COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, we would send them home and public health advice must then be followed.

From 16 August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will <u>no longer be required to self-isolate</u> if they are a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case.

Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test.

All individuals must take a PCR test if advised to do so before returning to school.



SUMMER CONCERT

In Reception, they have been trying some weaving, sewing and woodwork.


