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SATS AND WHOLE SCHOOL ASSESSMENT WEEKS

Our Y6 children took their national Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) last week, Monday 8^{th -} 11th May. They have all worked so hard this year and have made so much progress. Well prepared by their teachers, the children were confident, positive and resilient in their approach to the tests in spite of high expectations from the Department for Education (DfE) since the introduction of new tests last year.



Y2 children will be assessed for their end of key stage achievement during the two weeks before half term (beginning 15th May). They will also be given test papers from the DfE this year.

Y1 children will take a Phonic Screening Check during the week beginning 12th June to see if they are on track with learning strategies for early reading.

Other year groups will also be assessed over the next few weeks to track their attainment and progress.

Please ensure your children attend school during these important weeks and keep up the good practice of making sure your children have a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast.



GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK WEEK



The week Monday 15th - Friday 19th was our school's geography fieldwork week. The national curriculum requires children to be competent in geographical skills, including collecting, analysing and communicating with a range of data that is gathered through experiences of fieldwork, that deepens their understanding of geographical processes.

KS1 children should be able to:

- Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language, eg. near and far/left and right to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

K52 children should be able to:

- Use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps)
- Use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.

It has been a great week - the children really enjoyed the fieldwork and gained new knowledge and skills.

They enjoyed being out and about noticing and experiencing our wonderful world.

WORMLEY SCHOOL RECEIVES THE INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL AWARD FROM THE BRITISH COUNCIL FOR ITS MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES CURRICULUM Celebrating good learning in French by the children at Wormley.

In French we have been focussing on the Geography and History of French speaking countries.

Year 4 studied Cameroon where a lot of our cocoa (which makes chocolate) comes from;

You have planned very thoroughly for this cross-curricular approach to language teaching and included the aims of developing the pupils as citizens who appreciate the similarities and differences between different cultures, and who treat others with respect and tolerance. You have also widened your pupils' horizons by focusing on a range of Francophone countries in different continents, so that the different year groups can make further comparisons when they share their work."
