We wish her many happy holidays - in term time!









#### RETURN TO SCHOOL

Please see important information regarding the return to school in September - Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September.

Beginning and end of the day

Entrance	Location of gate	Year Group
Entrance A	Front gate	Y2, Y3
Entrance B	Gate to KS1 playground	YR, Y1
Entrance C	Gate next to Preschool	Preschool, YN
Entrance D	Back gate	Y4, Y5, Y6



There will still be staggered start and finish times and a *soft start* for each class to allow for children to enter the classroom and to wash their hands before settling to a learning task.

At the end of the day, parents will collect their children from the same entrance as the one they dropped them to.

School will have four start and finish times

Year group	Start time	Finish time
YR, Y2, Y4, Y6 (even numbers)	8:45	3:15
Y1, Y3, Y5 (odd numbers)	8:50	3:20
Preschool, YN mornings	9:00	12:00

Morning registers will close at 9:00 am - after this point your child will be marked as late.

#### Attendance

Attendance is compulsory if children are well. If children are not well, they should not attend. It is <u>essential</u> that parents make the school aware of the reason for any pupil absence before the start of the day by emailing attendance@wormleyprimary.co.uk

If parents do not let us know why their child is

absent, a member of the school admin team will have to phone the family of every child who is not in school. As winter approaches, your child may experience symptoms such as a cough or a temperature. To rule out COVID, please test your child to keep the spread of the virus low. Children are only required to stay at home for 3 days.

#### Uniform

Children are expected to wear our school uniform when they return in September. Please see the website if you need to clarify what children should wear to school and for PE.

PE kits should be worn all day on the day children have PE.

#### Payments via Arbor

Payments for school meals, Breakfast and After School Club (BASC), resources etc. should continue to be made via online payments using Arbor. There is also a post box in front of reception.

#### Healthy Home Packed Lunches and Water Bottles

A reminder that home packed lunches must be healthy and meet all nutritional expectations for meals consumed in school. Water bottles - marked with children's names - are essential please.

#### Breakfast and After School Club (BASC)

Breakfast and After School Club can be booked via Arbor for the Autumn Term. Please note that if there is an outstanding balance on your account, you will not be able to book a session.

#### Trips, Visits and Visitors

We have already booked history workshops and visits for the Autumn Term. Please check the website for dates already in the school calendar for 2022-2023. We will also be using the local environment for local History and Geography studies.

#### Home Learning and Remote Learning

For setting home learning, sharing information and in preparation for any possible isolation periods (due to having contracted COVID), we will continue to use Tapestry for Preschool, YN and YR and the Google Classroom for Y1- Y6. Please ensure you have access to these platforms in the Autumn Term. They are currently being set up.

#### When to isolate or take a test

We have seen a rise in cases of COVID which has affected staffing levels. Pupils, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. Children and adults should not come to school if they have symptoms and have had a positive test result due to the risk of spreading the virus.

If anyone in our school should develop COVID-19 symptoms, we would send them home. Children are not required to isolate if family members have COVID.



#### Good Hygiene Practices

We continue to practice and encourage good hygiene practices to keep all germs at bay.



#### ARTS WEEK

The children have really enjoyed our Arts Week.

In Art, they have been studying artists, including Andy Warhol, Hockney and Henri Rousseau, trialling their techniques and evaluating their own responses. They have been experimenting with different mediums such

as clay, paint, pastels and watercolour.

In DT, year groups have been designing, making and evaluating, including moving story books and sewing cases for telephones.

In Music, Y6 have had our music specialist who has been teaching pulse, rhythm and pitch as the children learn to play the ukulele. Whilst different genres have been learnt in different year groups, including reggae, pop and motown.



#### FRENCH LEARNING

It has been a pleasure to see the children excel in using the French language and appreciating the culture of France.

As we say au revoir to **Year 6**, it has been moving to see them take the French language and their knowledge of French culture to give them confidence when studying a Modern Foreign Language option at their future secondary school. To complete their year and their time learning French at Wormley, the children were able to produce short videos about French vocabulary.

Meanwhile, **Year 5** learnt about the French Revolution in which the absolute monarch in France was overthrown to create a Republic, so the leader of the country is no longer a member of the royal family and therefore these days there is no king or queen in France, but instead they have a president. The revolution is celebrated every year on 14<sup>th</sup> July in France with 'Fete de la Bastille'. On the same day we remembered the events of the revolution by sharing baguettes – these breads are a symbol of the revolution because it had partly been caused by a wheat and grain shortage leading to high prices for bread. Baguette means stick (baton).





In Lower Key Stage 2, as we celebrated la Reine Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee, **Year 3** studied Louis XIV - the French king who had the longest reign in France - 72 years and 110 days! However, he did become king when he was just 4 years old!





Finally in **Year 4** we learnt about the French leader Napoleon, who left us with the amazing quote "The word impossible is not in my dictionary." We were also able to each produce a replica of Napoleon's distinctive hat, (see the photograph).

We are excited to announce that **Gadgeteers**, **Summer Reading Challenge 2022** will launch in all Hertfordshire libraries on Saturday 9 July!

Once again Hertfordshire Libraries are challenging children of all ages to read any six library books over the summer holidays and return to the library to tell staff all about them. They can read anything they want, including story books, information books, picture books, and even eBooks and eAudiobooks (available to download for free from BorrowBox). Children can read the books independently, or together with family and friends.

As children report back on what they have read, they'll collect a set of transferable stickers (some scratch and sniff). Each set of stickers will be provided for every two books read.

Every child who completes the Challenge by Saturday 3 September will be awarded with a medal,

certificate, and a pencil.

This year's Summer Reading Challenge kicks off on Saturday 9 July with a launch event at St Albans library. This event will feature many fun activities including Junk Robot modelling, 3D pens and stopmotion.

The Challenge is a fun way to maintain children's reading levels over the summer and provide them with a confidence boost. Best of all, it is completely **free** to take part!
